Who was Iuliu Hațieganu?

Called "the professor of Romanian medicine" by Tudor Arghezi, Iuliu Hațieganu (1885-1959), the professor after whom the Cluj University of Medicine and Pharmacy is named, was the one who set the foundation for the superior medical education system of Cluj.

In 1910 he graduated the Faculty of Medicine at the University of Cluj, later becoming the assistant to the then well-known professor, Zsigmound Puryesz, whose successor he became in time.

His special merits and Puryesz's vision helped Iuliu Hațieganu become professor of medical clinics at the University of Cluj and the first dean of the Faculty of Medicine between 1919 and 1920 and, in the early 1930's, the rector of the University of Cluj.

Iuliu Hațieganu put much emphasis on physical education, considering it necessary in superior education institutions. Therefore, between 1930 and 1932, he founded a youth park, the "Iuliu Hațieganu" sports park, on the Someș river.

In 1935, professor Hațieganu wrote "It has been proven that physical education is the best form of education, which synergically contributes to the strengthening of body and soul alike, to building character"

Author of several treatises, published in the most important journals in Europe, Hatieganu is also remembered as the author of the so-called "Elementary treatise of semiology and medical pathology". The three-volume book was re-edited several times until modern times.

Iuliu Hațieganu was a valuable man for his time, but also for his followers, both for his role in medicine, but for his great rhethoric. He was a great speaker, an outstanding teacher, close the students' hearts, and a good man.

Professor Iuliu Hațieganu is respected for his merits as clinician and teacher, renowned man of science, master of humanist culture – it is even said that he learned to love his neighbour from Hippocrates and from Pasteur patriotism.

Your first days at the UMF

Your first steps into the Aula...

your first laboratory, wearing the coat that will become over the years your best friend... the first shudder you get when a university professor speaks to you... your first time going out with your colleagues... your first exam session... the first broken test tube of many to come... the first multicolour finger from all the reactions... the first feeling that you're a student...

You will engage and partake in all this, in time. These, and many others which you will certainly feel on your own, because each of you is unique and every student at the Faculty of Pharmacy has their own story ... we open-heartedly open yours.

Meanwhile, to make your life just a bit easier, we've thought to offer you some information and guidance about your student life at the Faculty of Pharmacy:

Student groups and series: Students in a year are alphabetically organised in groups of approximately 10 students and split into two series. Beginning with the 4th year, the Romanian students are joined by their counterparts from the French section, studying their practical assignments together. Students in a series will attend their courses together, in the same amphitheatre. The series will have different timetables, but the same teachers in most subjects, so that the course material is the same, as well as the final examination.

Student ID: Proves that you are a student and is recieved (free of charge) at the Opening Ceremony, at the end of October, which is stamped every year, at the Deanship. In case of loss/damage to the student ID you may request a duplicate from the Deanship, after paying a tax which you can find in the Tax Annex.

Study contract: is signed by every student, during the registration in the 1st year of study and includes the student's and the University's rights and obligations concerning the educational process and is the foundation of establishing the financial obligations of the student. Registering from the 2nd year onwards and signing the Tax Annex of the study contract is made anually, by filling out the registration form. Completing this form must be made within the first 15 days of the school year.

Library ID: is given out by the UMF Library, on demand, free of charge. In order to receive your ID you need: your Student ID and your personal ID. The ID is valid for one school year, with the possibility of renewal.

Travel ID: is received in the 1st year and is stamped every year. This gives you the right to travel by train to any part of the country, free of charge. Free train transport will be given to all students registered in an accredited higher education institution: state or private, from study programmes to all the three cycles (Undergraduate, Master's, Doctorate), irrespective of the study finance method (budget/tax), irrespective of age, nationality, for an unlimited number, distance of route of the trips, including during the holiday period, by all railway operators.

Transport facilities: students in Cluj can benefit from public transportation discounts by obtaining any of the different Student ID cards (Studcard, Omnipass, ISIC). Students in the "Budget" section will benefit from a 100% discount on two public transport routes, while those in the "Tax" section will benefit from a 50% discount for the pass. The discount can be obtained from the RATUC kiosks, with your Student ID, Student Card and your Travel ID. A passport-type photograph and a 2 RON tax are also necessary for procuring your pass.

Year Tutors: they are teachers assigned by the Professoral Council to guide and support the students.

Each assigned tutor will guide their series until its graduation.

Student Doctor's Office: you can find it in the Haşdeu dorm VII, it offers free medical assistance to UMF students. Here you must bring your medical forms necessary for motivating your medical absences.

Mobilities

ERASMUS Grants: Study mobilities programme, based on interinstitutional accords between the UMF and partner universities whose purpose is to allow students to take advantage of the educational, linguistic and cultural experience of studying in universities abroad. At the same time, it promotes cooperation between instututions and enriching the educational environment of the host institutions, as well as contributing to the development of human resources comprised of qualified open-minded youths, with international experience in their profession. Any student can partake in Erasmus by going through the selection process, based on a portofolio and an interview, in order to have the opportunity to study between 3-13 months or to complete their practical training/research stages in another country. At the University level, this programme is managed my the Department of International Relations, and at the Faculty level, the Prodean responsible with the administrative activity, the material basis. Interfarma: A FASFR (Federation of Romanian Pharmacist Student Associations) programme, organised by the OSF, through which any student can apply and spend a week in another Romanian Faculty of Pharmacy. Participating students (after being selected) have the obligation to partake in all scholarly activities of the "host" University so that, with the University's accord, all their presences are recognised upon their return to Cluj-Napoca. Interpractis: A national project organised with the help of the FASFR, meant for pharmacy students. The project offers the possibility to complete their summer practice in other academic centres in the country, for two weeks. After their practice hours, the organisers and the volunteers offer the students from other centres other social activities, such as visiting the local city, but also to make friends. Moreover, the paticipants can join workshops on their professional development as pharmacists, as well as personal development. SEP (Student Exchange Programme): IPSF programme (International Pharmaceutical Students' Federation) which offers students all around the world an unique cultural and educational experience, the chance to see what the pharmaceutical field implies abroad, the project being implemented in Romania through the FASFR. This way, you have the chance to complete your summer practice in community pharmacies, in a hospital pharmacies, clinical pharmacies, research or industry. Participants are chosen based on a written application (CV and letter of intention) and an interview in English, coordinated by a Local Exchange Officer (LEO), who is the person responsible with an SEP centre. The number of participating students is different every year, according to the number of students accepted by a centre. A student may apply for 3 countries, their order being taken into consideration. Priority is given to older students, who also have some volunteering work within our organisation. If you wish to volunteer in this project, you may partake during 3-4 weeks during the summer vacation. For more details, you may contact: <u>leo_cluj@gmail.com</u>.

TWINNET: An international Student exchange programme, coordinated by the European Pharmacist Students' Association (EPSA). The purpose of this programme is to interconnect EPSA members by exploring the views, traditions, universities and pharmaceutical market in the member centres, specific to each country. This is done by a reciprocated one-week visit of two different centres in different countries by student groups. During that week, students will get to know the cultural centres, the local customs and the touristic points, they will come into contact with the host students and will gain new insight on how student life is in other centres, as well as their standards, how the University and the Faculty of Pharmacy look like and will engage in numerous unforgettable experiences.

Twinnet first took place in Cluj-Napoca between February 27th - March 3rd 2018, organised by the OSF, with help from the FASFR. During this period, the students from Cluj had the opportunity to get to know the students from the Association Amical des Étudiants en Pharmacie de Besançon (AAEPB), France. The experience was most interesting and captivating.



Organisation and Leadership of the Iuliu Hațieganu University of Medicine and Pharmacy, Cluj-Napoca

The Administration Council ensures the operative leadership of the University between the Senate meetings. It is comprised of: Rector – as president, prorectors, secretary of the Senate, faculty Deans, the general administrative director and the student representative.

At the Administration Council meetings, the rector may invite various other persons from the academic and aministrative leaders of the University.

The Senate is the superior leadership forum of the entire academic community in all its fields and is composed of teaching staff and students. Senate members are chosen according to the Electoral Rulebook, written and approved by the Senate, separated for the teaching staff and the students. Members of the University Senate are chosen according to the LEN nr. 1/2011 by those they represent (the entire academic community, including all students). All members have real rights and obligations.

The President of the Senate is chosen by popular vote by all the members of the Senate during the first Senate meeting. Now, this position is held by Prof. Ioan Ștefan Florian PhD.

Students make up 25% of the total Senate members, and the number of students from each Faculty is directly proportional to the total number of students of each Faculty. Therefore, the Senate has 6 students from the Faculty of Medicine, 2 students from the Faculty of Dental Medicine, 2 students from the Faculty of Pharmacy and one student from the English and French sections respectively. Senate decisions are only taken by populare vote, by a simple majority if the number of those present makes up at least 2/3 of the total Senate members. Absolute majority and secret vote procedures are applied any time the members of the Senate deem them necessary.

Organisation and Leadership of the Faculty of Pharmacy

The Faculty of Pharmacy is the second faculty in Cluj meant for higher medical education, founded after the Great Union. Being in a developed academic centre, the faculty had a large growth in the number of Romanian and foreign students, as well as a permanent diversification of the educational offer.

The UMF Library "Valeriu Bologa" was born in 1949 and currently holds a heritage of more than 300,000 volumes, books and magazines, of which an important rare book fund is found in the branch of the History of Medicine. The library is entirely computerized, and the entire active documentary fund is accessible online. All acquisition, cataloging, reader and borrowing transactions are done using an integrated system. The library is a member of EAHIL (European Association for Health Information and Libraries).

Dorm versus rent

One of the most difficult decisions we have to make when we become students, especially when our choice when it comes to college takes us away from home: student dorm or rent?

This decision can be quite complicated, because both the student dorms and renting have their own advantages and disadvantages, which a student must analyse carefully in order to make the right choice!

Student Dorms:

Socialisation is the defining trait of the student dorms, because you have either 2 or 3 roommates if you live in Haşdeu (H7, H9, H10) or Observator (O1, O6), or one roommate if you live in the B dorms. You manage to meet plenty of different people and make numerous friends in a very short period of time, and the older colleagues are very reliable when you need a helping hand or some friendly advice.

At the student dorms you develop your selfless spirit, sometimes you depend on your roommates, other times they depend on you. But you never risk being alone during all those times you need someone close, and the student dorm is the perfect place to form longstanding friendships. Still, you must be a tolerant, compassionate, open person and you have to be able to give up certain habits which might be bothersome.

Financially, staying in the student dorms is very advantageous, because everything is included in the bundle, you don't need to pay any extra bills.

Renting

Renting a place during college is very different from dorm life, as it offers you the possibility to choose both the people you stay with, as well as their number. Be they friends from your own or other colleges, by renting you have the chance of having your own room, meaning much more privacy than a dorm.

Being an UMF Student Representative

Someone who will fight for your rights before the Deanship and the Professors, someone organised and responsible, energetic and willing to listen. You're probably thinking it's complicated business, too much on your plate, but things are a bit different.

You've come through the amphitheatre door and felt a strange feeling, a kind of joy for things to come fused with a kind of anxiousness because everything around you is new: many unknown faces, or which you vaguely remember from the admission exam, the student look that you've brandished, maybe even the city and your home. But you see a friendly face in the crowd and, whether you know them or not, you head towards the empty seat next to them. "Socialising" is the key word for that day. Your first day in college as a student. So many things happenned around you that you couldn't even tell when two weeks already flew past and it is time for you to vote for your series representative. Who is the capable, trusty person you can rely on?

Let's see... Maybe throughout high school you didn't step aside when it came to involving yourself in projects. Maybe *the determination, initiative, leadership spirit, wide smile and diplomacy* are not strangers to you. One time, without realising that you were the leader, you organised your friends for an action, and it went really great!

Or another time when there was an issue to solve in your old high school class, someone had to speak to the class master and calmly express the opinion of your colleagues, and that someone was you. Don't you remember, with a smile on your lips, all the small details of that situation? Surely you've thought of yourself as being the leader of a group. Or maybe this is the first time, but you wish to overcome your limits. Why not be a series representative, a student representative in the Faculty Council or even in the University Senate?!

Basically, what do you have to do as series representative? You will have to be receptive to the various issues that may arise over the course of the year: grant offers, student projects, staff announcements that must be transmitted. But the greatest challenge is during the examination period. *It is the series representative who sets de date of the exams.* So, after you succeed, one way or another, to please your colleagues with the proposed dates, you will have to negociate the amphitheatres with the older students. It is probably one of the biggest responsibilities of the series representative. Especially because there are always complaints, but my friendly advice is to listen to the majority.

They may seem many, but it is not really so. It is normal to be more *reserved* in the beginning, but an *active, leading* person, who approaches the situations with *diplomacy and tactfulness*, ready to answer your colleagues' questions *punctually and logically*, who keeps their *calm and their head on their shoulders* in more tense situations is **the ideal candidate**. And because

these qualities can be polished and need some willpower and determination to come out, I advise you to think about yourself!

Who? Me? Yes, you! Because you certainly have at least some of those qualities! In addition, it's worth it to try something new or scary. Do you think the professors will eye you? Yes, but at least they will get to know you. Do you think you will get into trouble for speaking your mind? Come on! As long as you speak *politely* and especially *rationally*, anyone will appreciate *initiative* and will listen to you.

Don't think that because you are a series representative you'll start prancing around the halls of the UMF as if they were a boulevard. You are first and foremost a student and a small example for your colleagues. Your absences will not be motivated for being a representative and you won't get any extra marks in your exams. You will find sympathy from the teaching staff, but don't expect favoritisms. "What you get" from all this is *the respect of your colleagues and your teachers alike, experience, new perspectives and the possibility to grow.*

That being said, see you around the UMF. Maybe at the council or in the OSF projects, parties, or exchanges!

Things you need to know about representation

Each student **group** must have a group representative which is chosen by direct, open and public vote. Any student has the right to run for *Student Group Representative*.

Each student **series** must have a series representative chose from the students of said series. Any student in the series has the right to run for *Student Series Representative*.

The winner is the candidate who receives at least 50%+1 of the total number of votes. The Series Representative then informs the secretariate of the results.

Group and series representatives have the following *rights*:

- \checkmark to be informed of all decisions affecting the group/series/year they represent
- \checkmark to program the exams of the students they represent, after consulting both them and the examining teachers

At the same time, group and series representatives have the following *obligations*:

- ✓ to inform the students they represent of the adoption of decisions that affect them, including decisions of the Departments, of the Faculty Council and the University Senate
- \checkmark to consult with Council and Senate student members regarding representation activities.

All Student Representative elections (regardless of their type) are only considered valid if during the voting process at least 50%+1 of that total voting members are present.

Being an OSF Volunteer means having the passion necessary to spare from your time in favour of activities helping to develop your society and profession. It means working with friends and future best friends in order to create things that you can be proud of. Being an OSF volunteer means not only the volunteering work itself, but also being adopted into a great united family you won't want to ever leave

It is impossible to summarize all our feelings on the subject, but you can say that an OSF volunteer is that person who is always ready to come to your aid, waiting nothing in return, a person who cares about the future and about how it will look. Always surrounded by friends and always willing to learn and grow, ALWAYS AN OSF-ist.

Why volunteer?

Because student life grows differently when you are part of a team, because you can be so much more than a mere student, you can gain new insight and overcome barriers you would have never thought possible to reach.

Because nothing compares itself to the satisfaction of success in a group of friends and colleagues with whom you share the same passions. You will have the chance to develop, help and be helped, to have fun in ways you never have before. The OSF is an unique experience that shapes you, it is a team waiting to be completed by you and your enthusiasm.

Because we always say that nothing ever changes and want to show that we are the change

Because, with us, your new ideas can materialise, and this way you can leave your mark in the development of OSF projects and educating society.

How to volunteer?

...it's very simple! Look for our contact data, visit us in our HQ, take part in the department meetings, be a part of our team. Be involved in projects, contribute and surprise us with new ideas. We know you can, you just need to want to!

In order to better familiarise yourself with the OSF, we invite you to partake in the "Freshmen Week", an event dedicated to you, fresh student of our faculty, which will take place in the third week of school.

Moreover, if you wish to join our team, to become an active member of our organisation and be a part of our departments, we are looking forward to knowing you better at the Interviews and to go to the "Recruitment camp", where you will get a taste of your first team building experience with older volunteer, from which you will be able to learn all about the organisation's life.

The Faculty of Pharmacy will offer you all the knowledge you need in order to become the professionals of tomorrow.



As for foreign educational institutions, Cluj offers a variety of cultural centers such as: The French Cultural Center (22, Ion I. C. Brătianu street), the "J. F. Kennedy" American Cultural Center (22, Iuliu Maniu street), the British Cultural Center (11, Arany Janos street), the German Cultural Center-Deutsches Kulturzentrum Klausenburg (7-9, Universității street), the Italian Cultural Center (7-9, Universității street), the Japanese Art and Culture Center (57-62, Plopilor street) and the Sindan Cultural Center (3-5, Universității street).

Cluj-Napoca is an important medical center, partly due to its established prestige as a universitary center. Here, you can find numerous medical institutions, clinics, as well as elite Romanian institutes and hospitals.

As a universitary center, Cluj is home to old academic traditions, with a very developed cultural and spiritual life.
